Sister Salons for **Guatemala** ► In Barcenas.

Guatemala, women face life-threatening violence and poverty. You've helped us respond with Sister Salons, where women will develop marketable skills as hair stylists and become peer counselors for abused women in their community. Sister Salons will enable women to benefit from a community of support and work together to end cycles of poverty and violence.





The Greenhouse Project A In northeastern Kenya, Indigenous Rendille People face floods, droughts and diminishing natural resources because of climate change. MADRE, in collaboration with the Indigenous Information Network, is now partnering with the Merigo Women's Group, a women-owned, organic agricultural cooperative. Through MADRE, you'll enable these women to grow the food their families depend on and overcome the environmental challenges they face.

**▼WOMEN IN THE US AND NICARAGUA RISE UP** In **1983**, angered by the US-backed war against civilians in Nicaragua, we took action. We joined with our sisters in Nicaragua to end the mass killings, rape and torture. Together, we created an organization dedicated to social justice, peace and women's human rights. We called ourselves MADRE, in honor of mothers who risk everything to protect their children and their communities.

## MILK AND MEDICINE FOR IRAQ ➤ In 1992, after US bombs spread suffering across Iraq, MADRE brought 10 tons of milk and medicines to decimated hospitals. We're still standing with our Iraqi sisters today, bringing aid to their communities, sheltering women from violence and demanding justice for the illegal US war.



◆ HEALTH CARE AND HOPE FOR WOMEN AND GIRLS IN HAITI In 1996, MADRE co-founded Haiti's first ever women's health

clinic. With our local partners, MADRE continued to support women in Haiti after the 2010 earthquake. Here, Yifat delivers shoes to a young earthquake survivor at the KOFAVIV Women's Center, one of 5,000 pairs donated through your support.

HUMANITARIAN AID
THAT BREAKS BARRIERS

IN CUBA ➤ For decades, the US embargo has cut Cuban women and families off from vital medical supplies, challenging Cuba's model public health system. In 1999, MADRE members helped us

✓ SEEDS, TOOLS AND TRAINING TO SUDAN In 2007,

MADRE co-founded Sudan's first ever women's farmers union. Together with our local partners, we're providing 3,000 organic farmers in over 50 communities with the seeds and supplies their families need to survive.

◆ SAFE BIRTHS IN PALESTINE In 2013, Yifat gathered with our Palestinian-Israeli sister organization, Midwives for Peace, to celebrate their 5-year anniversary. Our midwife partners have reached out across the conflict that surrounds them to ensure over 600 safe births for mothers in

MADRE works in partnership with community-based women's organizations on peace building, women's health and combating violence against women, and economic and environmental justice. Since we began in 1983, MADRE members have delivered over 30 million dollars worth of support to our partners in Latin America, the Caribbean, the Middle East, Africa, Asia, the Balkans and the United States. MADRE and YOU are proof that together, we can make the world we all want to see.
