
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You opened a new healing center for former child soldiers in Colombia.

MADRE celebrates women activists building the peaceful, healthy and safe world we all need. In the face of war, disaster and despair, you support women standing up for hope. Here are just a few that inspire us:

Stella, Colombia

Stella leads Taller de Vida, MADRE's partner group, and together we provide critical counseling and healing art therapy to former child soldiers. Colombia hit a setback when the peace deal to end more than 50 years of war was voted down in a national referendum. Still, Stella has hope for peace and healing.

"For me, peace means justice. I imagine peace with young girls who can live a real childhood and have good schooling. With Indigenous and Afro-Colombian communities who can celebrate their cultures. With leaders who listen to their people. I would like to say to the women worldwide who have lived through war like us: there's hope. Always raise your voice, and always join hands with other women. We can build a global chain of solidarity, together and stronger."

Eunice, Kenya

Eunice is a young community health worker with the Indigenous Information Network, MADRE's partner in Kenya. She's also an innovator and a homespun engineer. She knew that women's practice of cooking indoors over an open fire was clogging up their lungs with smoke. What's more, their inefficient stoves were using up too much firewood, stripping away the forests nearby.

She saw a problem, and she fixed it: Eunice built a new kind of stove, with local, easy-to-find materials. It's an updated version of an old Indigenous design, and she was proud of the improvements she made. It uses 80% less wood and produces far less smoke, making cooking efficient and healthy. And it's easy to build. Eunice is taking what she's learned to help other women build stoves, safeguard their families' health and sustain their communities.

Awaz, Iraq

"When I can't help everyone, I feel it deeply in my heart."

Awaz is a brave, young activist we work with in Iraq. She told us about the brand new rape crisis center for Yazidi girls fleeing ISIS sexual slavery that she helps MADRE run with our local partner, the Organization of Women's Freedom in Iraq. Working with girls who have been so traumatized by war and sexual violence is not easy. But every day, Awaz is determined to do more, to reach even more young women with lifesaving shelter, food, counseling and medical aid. And she knows she can do it, with your support.

"Let me tell you something," she said, "women and girls can achieve a lot when we support each other."
