In Iraq, you support an organic Women's Peace Farm that shelters and feeds women farmers escaping rape and sexual slavery by the extremist group ISIS. Thanks to you, 54 people, mainly mothers and their children, have found safe haven at the farm, where they are receiving counseling and medical care. "When I came here, I had lost everything. I couldn't sleep at night," one mother told us. "But I can breathe here, and my children are safe and going to school. Thank you."
