




Mothers Are Builders of Peace

In some of the world's toughest places, mothers ensure their families' survival, strengthen their communities and build the peaceful world we all need. This Mother's Day, we honor them.

In the Olepolos community of Kenya, nearly a third of women like Elinah are widows, after their husbands were killed in violent clashes between communities. They also face severe drought caused by climate

"Since my husband died, my son depends on me. We are all we have. I need to keep him safe and healthy. When he got sick from dirty water, I felt helpless. But then, I learned how to plant trees to protect our water sources. My neighbors and I have planted over 400 trees in our nursery! And we installed a clean water well. Now, my son



COLOMBIA

During decades of war, women and girls in Colombia, like Manuela and her daughters, have been caught in the crosshairs, uprooted from their homes and targeted with rape.

"My daughters and I had a happy, peaceful life. But in a flash, it was gone. When the guerrillas came to our town, they brought violence and destruction. They raped my daughter. I felt so afraid and powerless, but I knew I had to keep fighting for my daughters. They didn't deserve to live in fear." -MANUELA

KENYA

Many Syrian refugee women and girls have survived rape, forced marriage and displacement, during their country's five-year war.

"I remember how happy I felt when my daughter was born. I swore I would protect her. And that's what I'm doing. We fled Syria when I heard they were raping girls my daughter's age. I was frightened when we arrived at the camp. But then I found women who were offering support and care. They helped us feel safe. And now, my daughter is happy in school. And I have friends to lean on." -sara
